FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The **CHMM credential** recognizes individuals who have the necessary professional qualifications, expertise, and work experience to manage and consult on environmental, health and safety (EH&S) concerns.

Federal and state governments and many private businesses recognize the value of the CHMM credential and some require it in the performance of specific EH&S activities. Examples are: U.S. EPA; Army Corps of Engineers; National Park Service; U.S. Air Force; Dept of Veterans Affairs, FDIC; New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; States of Connecticut; Indiana; Kentucky; and New York; General Motors; ENSR, 3E, Tetra Tech, Shaw Group, Terracon, Boeing, Sarah Lee, URS, and others.

The CHMM credential is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), which meets ANSI/ISO/IEC 17024. Additionally, the Certified Hazardous Materials Manager (CHMM®) credential is also accredited by the Council of Engineering and Scientific Specialty Boards (CESB), which meets ASTM Standard E 1929-98 for Personnel Certification Programs.



You do not have to be a CHMM to be a member of RMC-CHMM. The RMC welcomes all EHS&S professionals, students, and others interested in EH&S issues.
